



Our last meeting was the visit of Pine Gap David Rosenburg and is reported as it progressed with sundry comments, that may not be entirely factual with my inability to note everything mentioned.



After Geoff's introduction to David Rosenberg speaking on Pine Gap, David handled the noisy club's public interruptions so well, that everyone was able to maintain a clear picture of Pine Gap and its real objectives.

Very quickly, he set the scene of 1966 project of a joint defense facility between USA and Australia and its completion in1970 as an operational base. He quickly and clearly, with a high degree of a feeling of truthfulness in his statements, dispelled many rumors attached to the project. The possibility of a vast underground area with nuclear facilities, was in reality a much smaller area for diesel machinery for the necessary air conditioning. What you see in the above photo is, what you have. It is a base for collecting information of Al-Qaeda and Taliban planning in Pakistan and Afghanistan, and this is important, and also often obtains a preventative. UFO and alien messages are not on the agenda. There are other observation areas for that. He suggested that the facility would have at least one satellite under its control but no suggestion of any large numbers. Likewise drone control is not their work and is USA controlled from elsewhere. He gave details of Australia's obligations as to that of USA. Where

Australia financed some one and a half billion USA had financed I think some 90% more. Either country can back out at any time. The base currently needs updating after 40 years of use and the need to increase surveillance. For care, maintenance and operation 800 total staff, the real operational staff means 4 shifts of 40 operators ie 160 The balance are for general staff. Percentage so employed is favorable to Australia as is the information obtained

Our last meeting was the visit of Pine Gap David Rosenburg and is reported as it progressed with sundry comments, that may not be entirely factual with my inability to note everything mentioned.

Security has been broken only once by 5 Australians and only then just through the parameters. In such an isolated area, easy early observation allows Federal Police time to support the local private security organisation. The air space is out of bounds for any aircraft but I expect that official planes would be allowed to operate if needed. The tenor of the talk gave everyone the confidence that Pine Gap is of vital benefit to Australia as well as USA.




